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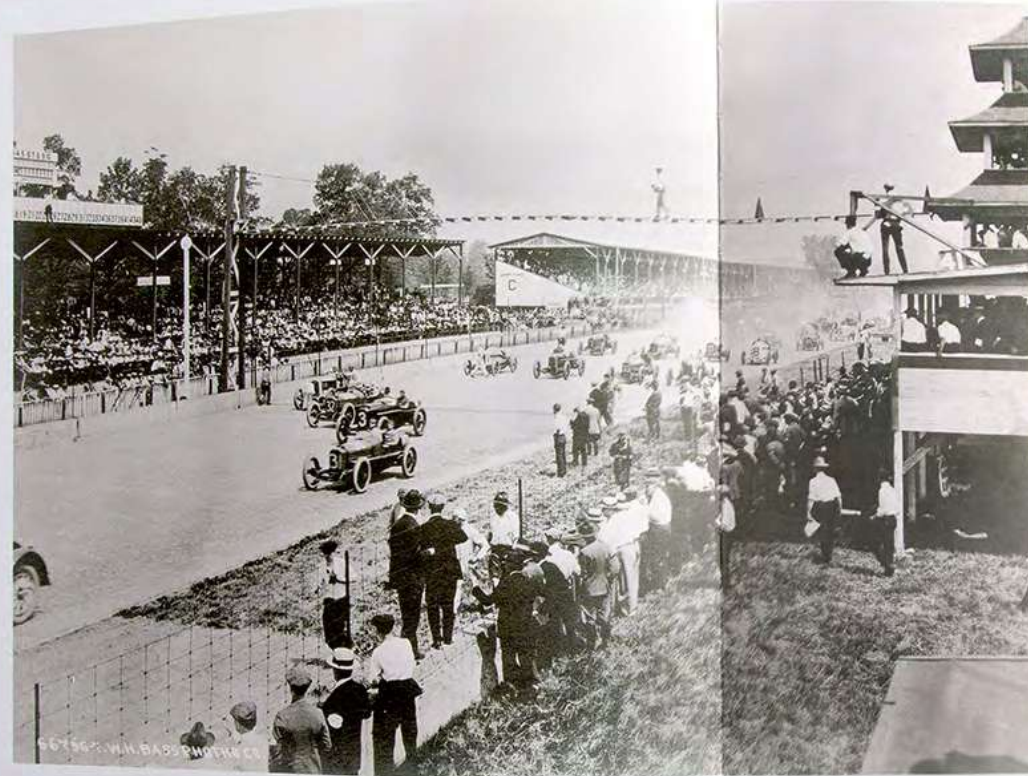
## The Fisher Island Club Opens & a New Era Begins

The Fisher Island Club finally opened its doors in 1987. The 1990s brought more residents and a fresh flush of glamour to the island.
